Lord, we pray that your grace may always precede and follow us, that we may continually be given to good works; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

The First Lesson: Isaiah 25:1-9

Note: The prophet issues the invitation to God to a people desperate to hear it. To a people under threat, surrounded by death, and in urgent need of a safe place this invitation to an abundant life is the only way of life. To such people this invitation is not a matter of casual theory or part of a religious hobby. Where do we see this in the world? Where do we see it in ourselves?

O LORD, you are my God;

I will exalt you, I will praise your name;

for you have done wonderful things,

plans formed of old, faithful and sure.

For you have made the city a heap,

the fortified city a ruin;

the palace of aliens is a city no more,

it will never be rebuilt.

Therefore strong peoples will glorify you:

cities of ruthless nations will fear you.

For you have been a refuge to the poor,

a refuge to the needy in their distress,

a shelter from the rainstorm and a shade from the heat.

When the blast of the ruthless was like a winter rainstorm,

the noise of aliens like heat in a dry place,

you subdued the heat with the shade of clouds;

the song of the ruthless was stilled.

On this mountain the LORD of hosts will make for all peoples

a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines,

of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear.

And he will destroy on this mountain

the shroud that is cast over all peoples,

the sheet that is spread over all nations;

he will swallow up death forever.

Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces,

and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the LORD has spoken.

It will be said on that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us.

This is the LORD for whom we have waited;

let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

The Psalm 23

Note: In this familiar psalm we see another call of God which is anything but otherworldly. God calls us to follow him through the world, confident in his provision. Where have you felt such provision? Where do we need such provision?

Dominus regit me

1 The Lord is my shepherd; *

I shall not be in want.

2 He makes me lie down in green pastures * and leads me beside still waters.

3 He revives my soul '

and guides me along right pathways for his Name's sake.

4 Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I shall fear no evil; *

for you are with me;

your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

5 You spread a table before me in the presence of those who trouble me: *

you have anointed my head with oil, and my cup is running over.

6 Surely your goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, *

and I will dwell in the house of the LORD for ever.

The Epistle: Philippians 4:1-9

Note: These closing passages from the letter encourages the people in their walk with God. Paul not only seeks to dissuade their worry about the dangers of the world around them but reveals to them that their life in God changes them from the inside, to embody the excellency of God, and that is entirely connected to the confident love with which they are able to live in the world. The call of God saves us from worry and saves us to a life of love.

My brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved.

I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. Yes, and I ask you also, my loyal companion, help these women, for they have struggled beside me in the work of the gospel, together with Clement and the rest of my co-workers, whose names are in the book of life.

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

The Holy Gospel: Matthew 20:1-16

Note: The Parable of the Wedding Feast has many interpretations and is just a puzzling as the Wicked Tenants last week. What are the odd pieces? Maybe it is the improperly dressed guest that turns up and is turned out in a terrible way. Maybe it has something to do with not merely showing up for God, but accepting the call in something that seems to reflect the spirit of the invitation itself. We are not called to be a wallflower at the feast of the living God.

Once more Jesus spoke to the people in parables, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, 'Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.' But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his slaves, mistreated them, and killed them.

The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his slaves, 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.' Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.

"But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?' And he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' For many are called, but few are chosen."

Responding to God's Call

The word "woke" has developed all sorts of social and political meanings in our culture. I would appeal to a more fundamental, biblical meaning and avoiding the spectacle of going into the weeds of culture conflict.

The prophets constantly are trying to awaken the people from their indifference or their ignorance or their disobedience toward God and God's loving covenant with them. Being awakened prophetically is precisely the mission of Jesus who startles us as the very presence of the living God.

Being awakened in this sense is being delivered from being spiritually comatose and living our lives as functional atheists regardless of what we profess formally. We are always subject to this condition, as the poet says "the world is too much with us". We are always tempted to live as if God does not exist in what we say and do and think.

But God does not give up on us. God keeps calling us to the fuller awareness of his presence. More than that he calls us forward to join him in the work of the Spirit.

But a call is just a call, even from God, if it goes unanswered. The call of God calls for a response from us. Being awakened to God's world is only the beginning of the journey, often picked up again and again throughout our lives.

Come to my banquet, God calls us, let me feed you with my abundance and let me lead you into the world nourished by the Spirit. I love you, God says, now love me.

Where has God awakened you in your life? How will you respond? How might you and the world around you look different?
