# The Collect

Almighty and everliving God, in your tender love for the human race you sent your Son our Savior Jesus Christ to take upon him our nature, and to suffer death upon the cross, giving us the example of his great humility. Mercifully grant that we may walk in the way of his suffering, and also share in his resurrection; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

# The First Lesson: Isaiah 50:4-9

Note: The figure of the mysterious servant appears at least four times in Isaiah. In a narrative around 500 years prior to the birth of Jesus, the parallels with his life are remarkable. He has been sent by God to save, he is entirely faithful and obedient, and he suffers for the sake of his mission.

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher,

that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word.

Morning by morning he wakens-wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught.

The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backward.

I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard;

I did not hide my face from insult and spitting.

The Lord God helps me;

therefore I have not been disgraced;

therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near.

Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together.

Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me.

It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

#### Psalm 31: 9-16 In te. Domine. speravi

Note: This psalm celebrates a God that welcomes back those that have gone astray. It contrasts the bitter reality of being separated from God with the supreme joy of finding oneself renewed again in God's presence.

9 Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I am in trouble; \* my eye is consumed with sorrow, and also my throat and my belly.

10 For my life is wasted with grief. and my years with sighing; ' my strength fails me because of affliction, and my bones are consumed.

11 I have become a reproach to all my enemies and even to my neighbors, a dismay to those of my acquaintance; '

when they see me in the street they avoid me.

# 12 I am forgotten like a dead man, out of mind; \* I am as useless as a broken pot.

13 For I have heard the whispering of the crowd; fear is all around; \* they put their heads together against me; they plot to take my life.

14 But as for me, I have trusted in you, O Lord. \* I have said, "You are my God.

15 My times are in your hand;

rescue me from the hand of my enemies, and from those who persecute me.

16 Make your face to shine upon your servant, \* and in your loving-kindness save me."

# The Epistle: Philippians 2:5-11

Note: This portion of the letter is thought to be an ancient Christian hymn which Paul has inserted into his text. I twas probably familiar to the church in Philippi and may have been part of a baptism ritual where the essence of the meaning of Christ was put to song.

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus,

who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited,

but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness.

And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death-even death on a cross.

Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name,

so that at the name of Jesus

every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

# The Gospel: Luke 23:1-49

Note: The passion of Jesus Christ is a complicated story, but it has one central theme: the violent rejection and unjust killing of the Son of the living God. What strikes you about this story this year? The betrayal is a close associate, even a friend? The blind, deaf, and heedless show trial? The indifference of the Roman authority? The generalized anger, anxiety, fear and mindless voracity of the crowd? Before Jesus died for our sins we might also consider that he died because of our sins.

#### Holy Week

Palm Sunday turns quickly into Passion Sunday. The bright hope of the triumphal entry into Jerusalem leads directly into the darkness of arrest, the trial, the scourging, and the cross. But hope is never extinguished. Hope, without question, is severely challenged in the realistic world of human injustice. It emerges, however, finally in triumph. Nevertheless, the drama of the challenge is necessary. We cannot see the glory of Christ quite so well unless we see precisely what Christ has overcome and still overcomes today. This Sunday begins this strange journey with the story of the Passion. The week that follows explores this story in more depth.

Tenebrae on Wednesday evening is a mediation rich in Old Testament images from the Psalms and Lamentations presented in the contest of light and shadow.

Maundy Thursday recalls the Last Supper, the Institution of the Holy Eucharist, and the commandment of love. The washing of the feet is a sign of our commitment to love. The stripping of the altar anticipates the price Jesus was willing to pay to love us. The Morning Watch Vigil follows for those who wish to participate.

Good Friday gives u an opportunity to dig deeper: the "3 Hours" between 12 and 3pm are a series of reflections on the seven last words of Christ. The Stations of the Cross begins at 6:30, followed by the service of Good Friday and the Veneration of the Cross.

Holy Saturday has a short service at gam to reflect Jesus' burial.

Morning Prayer is held every weekday in Holy Week at 9am. A good way to begin the day.
