The Collect

Almighty and merciful God, it is only by your gift that your faithful people offer you true and laudable service: Grant that we may run without stumbling to obtain your heavenly promises; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

The First Lesson: Daniel 7:1-3, 15-18

Note: The setting for this prophecy is the Hebrew captivity in Babylon in the 6th century BC. There Daniel has many visions about a coming turmoil in the world. Through it all, he assures the "holy ones", those who we might call saints, will prevail. In our own time of turmoil this is a message to hold close to our hearts.

In the first year of King Belshazzar of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head as he lay in bed. Then he wrote down the dream: I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another.

As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: "As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom for ever—for ever and ever."

Psalm 149 Cantate Domino

Note: This next to last psalm in the Psalter is part of the closing song of praise (doxology) which is found in the last 5 psalms, all full of halleluiahs. This one in particular describes the "congregation of the faithful" as singing praises to God as a fitting example for the saints to follow.

1 Hallelujah!

Sing to the Lord a new song; * sing his praise in the congregation of the faithful.

2 Let Israel rejoice in his Maker; *

let the children of Zion be joyful in their King.

- 3 Let them praise his Name in the dance; * let them sing praise to him with timbrel and harp.
- 4 For the Lord takes pleasure in his people * and adorns the poor with victory.
- 5 Let the faithful rejoice in triumph; 'let them be joyful on their beds.
- 6 Let the praises of God be in their throat * and a two-edged sword in their hand;
- 7 To wreak vengeance on the nations * and punishment on the peoples;

8 To bind their kings in chains * and their nobles with links of iron;

9 To inflict on them the judgment decreed; * this is glory for all his faithful people. Hallelujah!

The Epistle: Ephesians 1:11-23

Note: These opening verses lay a baptismal foundation for what is to follow about the living of a faithful life. We are marked by the Holy Spirit and made Christ own forever so that we might grow more and more into his image.

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

The Gospel: Luke 6:20-31

Note: These beatitudes are the introduction to Luke's "sermon on the plain" (compare with Matthew's Sermon on the Mount). They lay out the outline of the new world Christ has inaugurated with his coming where the first will be last and the last shall be first and sketches out the kind of moral life that is consistent with the good news he brings.

Jesus looked up at his disciples and said:

"Blessed are you who are poor,

for yours is the kingdom of God.

"Blessed are you who are hungry now,

for you will be filled.

"Blessed are you who weep now,

for you will laugh.

"Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets."

"But woe to you who are rich,

for you have received your consolation.

"Woe to you who are full now,

for you will be hungry.

"Woe to you who are laughing now,

for you will mourn and weep.

"Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.

"But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you.

Sing a Song of the Saints of God

There is a kind of spectrum of understanding about the saints depending on whether you lean more catholic or more protestant. A catholic understanding tends to think first about the saints as those folks in history who have made a name for themselves because of their faith. St. Clement is one example. Their value is that they can provide us with role models.

A more protestant understanding tends to downplay the stature of saints in the tradition in that they might tend to compete with the overarching significance of Christ. The protestant suspicion of devotions associated with the Blessed Virgin Mary is a notable example. In the New Testament, when the saints are mentioned, it is always referring to everyone in the church. All of us.

We who are the inheritors of the Episcopal and Anglican tradition are comfortable with both sides of the equation when it comes to the saints. We revere the great saints of the tradition for what they can, in their particular circumstances, teach us by their example what it means to follow Christ.

On the other hand, we are all saints. That doesn't mean that we are not sinners as well. It means God makes us saints, not because we are perfect but because God is all loving. As saints we pray that we will grow more and more into the image of the loving God who created us, sustains us, and redeems us.

At the heart of this process of sanctification, this work of God's Spirit, is our simple desire to become more and more a saint. To, as the old hymn goes, "sing a song of the saints of God", celebrating the great saints of the tradition, while at the same time declaring, "I want to be one too".
