The Collect

Almighty God, whose Son our Savior Jesus Christ is the light of the world: Grant that your people, illumined by your Word and Sacraments, may shine with the radiance of Christ's glory, that he may be known, worshipped, and obeyed to the ends of the earth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The First Lesson: Isaiah 49:1-7

Note: This is another one of the "servant songs" in Isaiah which the early church often associated with the Christ. These songs show a pattern of a human being who comes to declare and do the healing work of God. In this passage the work of the Servant reaches far beyond the people of Israel but stretches out into the whole world.

Listen to me, O coastlands,
pay attention, you peoples from far away!

The LORD called me before I was born,
while I was in my mother's womb he named me.

He made my mouth like a sharp sword,
in the shadow of his hand he hid me;

he made me a polished arrow,
in his quiver he hid me away.

And he said to me, "You are my servant,
Israel, in whom I will be glorified."

But I said, "I have labored in vain,
I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity;
yet surely my cause is with the LORD,
and my reward with my God."

And now the LORD says,
who formed me in the womb to be his servant,
to bring Jacob back to him,
and that Israel might be gathered to him,
for I am honored in the sight of the LORD,
and my God has become my strength--

he says,

"It is too light a thing that you should be my servant
to raise up the tribes of Jacob
and to restore the survivors of Israel;
I will give you as a light to the nations,
that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth."

Thus says the LORD,
the Redeemer of Israel and his Holy One,
to one deeply despised, abhorred by the nations,
the slave of rulers,
"Kings shall see and stand up,
princes, and they shall prostrate themselves,

because of the LORD, who is faithful,
the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you."

Psalm 40:1-12 Expectans, expectavi

Note: This psalm declares that those who wait on the Lord will receive the gift of inspired speech, to speak plainly and forthrightly the joy he has experienced in the presence of the Lord.

1 I waited patiently upon the LORD; *
he stooped to me and heard my cry.

2 He lifted me out of the desolate pit, out of the mire and clay; *
he set my feet upon a high cliff and made my footing sure.

3 He put a new song in my mouth,
a song of praise to our God; *
many shall see, and stand in awe,
and put their trust in the LORD.

4 Happy are they who trust in the LORD! *
they do not resort to evil spirits or turn to false gods.

5 Great things are they that you have done, O LORD my God!
how great your wonders and your plans for us! *
there is none who can be compared with you.

6 Oh, that I could make them known and tell them! *
but they are more than I can count.

7 In sacrifice and offering you take no pleasure *
(you have given me ears to hear you);

8 Burnt-offering and sin-offering you have not required, *
and so I said, "Behold, I come.

9 In the roll of the book it is written concerning me: *
'I love to do your will, O my God;
your law is deep in my heart.'

10 I proclaimed righteousness in the great congregation; *
behold, I did not restrain my lips;
and that, O LORD, you know.

11 Your righteousness have I not hidden in my heart;
I have spoken of your faithfulness and your deliverance; *
I have not concealed your love and faithfulness from the great congregation.

12 You are the LORD;
do not withhold your compassion from me; *
let your love and your faithfulness keep me safe for ever.

The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 1:1-9

Note: Paul's writes to each church because there is a problem, something that troubles the church. And he almost always begins with words of remembrance, to remember Christ, and in that remembering the church will begin to find its re-membering, its renewed connection to the living Christ and the beginning of its healing.

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes,

To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and

knowledge of every kind-- just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you-- so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Gospel: John 1:29-42

Note: John the Baptist acts primarily as a witness of Jesus in the gospel of John. Notably, we do not have the scene in the other gospels of John performing the baptism. That may be taken for granted. John clearly has seen it and, having seen it and been a witness, he feels called to testify to it to others.

John saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."

The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

Epiphany and the Way of Love

We are beginning, next Sunday, the journey of the Way of Love. Our last, and now retired, Presiding Bishop Michael Curry developed this way of seeing and practicing our faith. Details can be found on the Episcopal Church website.

There are seven steps: Turn, Learn, Pray, Worship, Bless, Go, and Rest. Anyone going through confirmation or being received or reaffirming their faith should attend this series which will continue all the way through Epiphany and Lent.

Next Sunday we will reflect on the first step, Turning. The gospel reading from John this Sunday helps us in our reflection as John the Baptist acts first as a witness to Jesus as the Christ. His witness leads others to turn to Jesus and to become witnesses themselves and lead others to turn to Jesus.

"What are you looking for?" Jesus asks the disciples who come following him. They are looking for a new way, a different way. In Jesus they have an epiphany, a moment of amazing revelation. They discover in Jesus the Way of Love.

Many things keep us off-track of this Way, even if we have seen it and experienced it. The church in Corinth got off track in some important ways and St. Paul begins his letter to them reminding them of the epiphany they found in Jesus.

We all need such reminders, practices and people in our lives, that help us to realize that Turning isn't just a one-off step on our part, but a continuous process of turning to Christ in the face of things which turn us away from him. And, in turning, being reminded of the amazement of Jesus, the amazing love of Christ.




