The Collect

Keep, O Lord, your household the Church in your steadfast faith and love, that through your grace we may proclaim your truth with boldness, and minister your justice with compassion; for the sake of our Savior Je-  
sus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God,  
now and for ever. Amen.

The First Lesson: Exodus 19:2-8a

Note: Mt. Sinai is where the Jewish people receive the Law and, some have said,  
became what we know as the Jewish people. With the Law is given a commission-  
ing. Israel is to be a priest to the world.

The Israelites had journeyed from Rephidim, entered the wilderness of Sinai,  
and camped in the wilderness; Israel camped there in front of the mountain.  
Then Moses went up to God; the LORD called to him from the mountain, say-  
ing, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the Israelites: You  
have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings  
and brought you to myself. Now therefore, if you obey my voice and keep  
my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession out of all the peoples.  
Indeed, the whole earth is mine, but you shall be for me a priestly kingdom  
and a holy nation. These are the words that you shall speak to the Israelites."

So Moses came, summoned the elders of the people, and set before  
them all these words that the LORD had commanded him. The people  
all answered as one: "Everything that the LORD has spoken we will do."

Psalm 100: Jubilate Deo

Note: This wonderful, short psalm is worth memorizing and making it portable.  
Even if it's only the first verse: "Be joyful!". Joy comes from knowing we are crea-  
tures of God, made in God's image. And we respond in gratitude. Why? Because  
God is good.

- 1 Be joyful in the LORD, all you lands; \*  
serve the LORD with gladness  
and come before his presence with a song.
- 2 Know this: The LORD himself is God; \*  
he himself has made us, and we are his;  
we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.
- 3 Enter his gates with thanksgiving;  
go into his courts with praise; \*  
give thanks to him and call upon his Name.
- 4 For the LORD is good;  
his mercy is everlasting; \*  
and his faithfulness endures from age to age.

The Epistle: Romans 5:1-8

Note: We continue in our Sunday sequential reading from this letter, so important  
among all Paul's letters in describing the gift and task of discipleship. Prior to any-  
thing a disciple does, they begin in faith and confidence in the living God who, even  
during difficult times can produce grace from the worst of circumstances.

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus  
Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we  
stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that,  
but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endur-  
ance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and  
hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our  
hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For while we were still  
weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone  
die for a righteous person-- though perhaps for a good person someone might  
actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were  
sinners Christ died for us.

The Gospel: Matthew 9:35-10:8

Note: This continuation of the reading from Matthew's gospel leads us into one of  
the great discourses of Jesus in this gospel: this one having to do with discipleship.

Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and  
proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and eve-  
ry sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because  
they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said  
to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask  
the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over  
unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every  
sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also  
known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his  
brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax col-  
lector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean,  
and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go  
nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans,  
but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go,  
proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.'  
Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons.  
You received without payment; give without payment.

Walking in the Steps of the Apostles

We will be reading from Matthew on Sundays all the way to Advent (November 29) and here we pick up from last week where we saw the call of Matthew: here we have the call of the twelve apostles. This is the only place “apostle” is used, a term for “one who is sent”, rather than “disciple”, a student. Jesus has plans for us to practice what he preaches.

But first he sets an example before them. This is always the practice of Jesus, as though Christ is the master artisan and his followers are his faithful apprentices, being shown the way and then learning by doing. This does not guarantee success. But Paul reminds us, God can show grace even through our challenges and defeats.

But who does Jesus choose? He does not choose those who we might think as the powerful. Jesus recognizes that much of his concern for the people comes from oppression. He chooses what we might call ordinary people. He calls the fishermen and the somewhat risky choice of a Tax Collector and Zealot (revolutionary), and he calls them to serve the needs of the people.

And Jesus gives this example to follow: care for the needs of the people, rely completely on God to accomplish this, and then, do it again and again.
