The First Lesson: Deuteronomy 30:15-20

Moses said to all Israel the words which the Lord commanded him, "See, I have set before you today life and prosperity, death and adversity. If you obey the commandments of the Lord your God that I am commanding you today, by loving the Lord your God, walking in his ways, and observing his commandments, decrees, and ordinances, then you shall live and become numerous, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess. But if your heart turns away and you do not hear, but are led astray to bow down to other gods and serve them, I declare to you today that you shall perish; you shall not live long in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to enter and possess. I call heaven and earth to witness against you today that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Choose life so that you and your descendants may live, loving the Lord your God, obeying him, and holding fast to him; for that means life to you and length of days, so that you may live in the land that the Lord swore to give to your ancestors, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob."

The Epistle: Philemon 1-21

Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother,

To Philemon our dear friend and co-worker, to Apphia our sister, to Archippus our fellow soldier, and to the church in your house:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith toward the Lord Jesus. I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective when you perceive all the good that we may do for Christ. I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, my brother.

For this reason, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do your duty, yet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love-- and I, Paul, do this as an old man, and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful both to you and to me. I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel; but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a beloved brother -- especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. If he has wronged you in any way, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your own self. Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ. Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say.

For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Reflection on Sunday's Lessons

A few years ago, I began a new journey to explore the potential of a call to ordained ministry. I grew up in the Episcopal Church and worked for almost thirty years as a church musician in different parishes. But throughout that time I had a persistent feeling that, although I enjoyed what I was doing and found it fulfilling in many ways, there might be something more to my sense of vocation. So, I set out on a new path. I finished my commitments as a musician, entered seminary and the diocesan discernment process, and dedicated the next three years of life to learning, discovering, and listening. I listened for God's presence and call, I listened to what I was thinking and feeling, and listened to what was happening around me. It was a great exercise in trying to live in the moment.

One of the books I read during that time was "Now and Then: A Memoir of Vocation" by Frederick Buechner. In the final chapter, Buechner says, "Listen to your life. See it for the fathomless mystery that it is. In the boredom and pain of it no less than in the excitement and gladness: touch, taste, smell your way to the holy and hidden heart of it because in the last analysis all moments are key moments, and life itself is grace."

Our scripture readings this week all feature elements of listening. In Deuteronomy, Moses says, "If you obey the commandments of God by loving the Lord your God, walking in his ways, and observing his commandments...then you shall live and the Lord will bless you." Likewise in Luke 14, Jesus says, "Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple." These passages emphasize the importance of minimizing distractions, listening intently, and living in the moment. In order to obey and follow, we must first be able to hear and receive.

The commandments – God's laws – are clear about our primary vocation as the people of God. We are here to love God, love ourselves, and to love each other. As Buechner points out, life – and love, I would add – both include moments of boredom and excitement, pain and gladness. But it is by listening and living in the moment that we experience the grace of God's presence and that still, small voice that calls each of us, always, towards the fullness of life in Christ.
